Thank to you everyone who returned their requests for after school care. We need **54** filled spaces a week to pay for all the staffing, facilities and resources- we currently only have **36** requesting a space. We are currently looking into alternative ways to meet the need as well as applying for external funding to subsidise the costs to help us provide this key service to families. So unfortunately we cannot start the after school **yet**, we will keep families informed.

Safeguarding

Children can only be released to previously agreed people [adults/ siblings]- if you need someone else to collect your child you **must** inform the office in advance.



If this person is not known to the school the office will ask for contact details.



Children should be <u>reading at least 3 times per week</u>. This helps them attain the rewards they deserve.

Reminders of expectations:

Children's attendance should be **above 97%** - please avoid missing any days from school unless ill.

Absence calls must be made by a parent or carer by calling the school office before 9.10am. There is a designated answer machine for absence messages. Miss Hodson will then follow up any attendance queries as needed.

For safety reasons; <u>No hoodies or jewellery</u> for PE. PE T-shirts should be plain white, Joggers should be plain black or Navy. PE kit is uniform not outdoor learning/forest clothing.

School gates open at 8:35am and close at 8:45am. Children arriving after 8:45 miss the start of learning and are marked as late
